For many people interested in flags, a NAVA meeting is often their first opportunity to meet with others that share that interest. Each year NAVA holds its annual meeting somewhere in the United States or Canada, the largest vexillological conference on the continent. NAVA's meetings are often scheduled near the U.S. Columbus Day/Canadian Thanksgiving weekend. Those assembled enjoy fellowship with other vexillologists, hear papers presented on a wide variety of flag topics, go on field trips, view flag displays, exchange information, and trade or purchase books, flags, and related materials.

Awards and Grants

The Captain William Driver Award at each annual meeting recognizes the best presentation of vexillological scholarship.

The Cooper Conservation Grant helps conserve endangered flags in museum collections.

The Cannon Research Grant supports academic research in vexillology.

NAVA members include flag scholars and collectors, educators, museum professionals, government officials, flag manufacturers and retailers, writers, designers, and those interested in flags as a hobby. We are an all-volunteer, non-political, non-profit, multinational association.

NAVA members actively participate in many flag-related activities, including flag research and conservation, local flag-studies groups, World Vexillology Day (October 1), flag-design competitions, and sharing flag information with the public.

All NAVA members receive *Raven* (our annual scholarly journal) and *Vexillum* (our quarterly full-color magazine), our e-mail bulletin *Semaphore*, and access to the members-only section of NAVA.org (with recent publications, our member directory, and much more). Memberships are based on calendar years—new members receive all publications for the year they join.

What Does NAVA Do?

NAVA pursues the study of flags by:

- bringing into closer cooperation people interested in all aspects of flags such as their history, significance, specifications, use, design, sale, and manufacture
- furthering a strong and growing interest in flags as a serious study or as an avocation
- promoting research into the origins, history, design, and symbolism of flags
- publishing on flags and vexillology
- formulating standards for flag terminology, methodology, and data recording
- studying and providing guidance on flag usage and design through national surveys and guidebooks
- maintaining a Personal Flag Registry, documenting the flags of NAVA members
- cooperating with other vexillological associations, agencies, and research centers, and foundations
- representing vexillologists of North America on an international level (NAVA is a founding member of FIAV, the Fédération internationale des associations vexillologiques)

Membership

Joining NAVA is easy and inexpensive! Active membership for those 18 and over is US\$40

annually (US\$20 for full-time undergraduate and graduate students).

Associate membership for those under 18 (and spouses of active members) is US\$20 annually with all privileges of active membership except voting and holding elected office.

Organizational Membership for non-profit or for-profit Organizations is US\$60 annually, including preferred rates on exhibit space at the annual meeting, a listing on the Commercial Members page at www.nava.org, and all privileges of active members except holding office.
